Mr. Winch :

“Good evening and welcome to our Board of Education meeting for Wednesday, November 29th.

I am Superintendent of School Todd Winch and it is my distinct pleasure to facilitate some very special recognitions tonight.

Heroic Actions

Our first recognition is for a district employee who went above and beyond her job responsibilities in order to play a heroic role in the life of one of our students. At this time I am going to invite up the principal of East Broadway Elementary School Mr. Jordan Margolis and Ms. Janice Reyes-Luzzi. Ms. Reyes-Luzzi is being congratulated for administering the Heimlich maneuver on a student and saving their life.

Athletic Awards:

Our second set of recognitions is our fall athletes. Tonight we recognize outstanding achievement in our fall sports including our all County athletes, special awards, and coaches of the year. To present these awards please welcome our Director of Physical Education, Athletics and Health Mr. Keith Snyder.

College Board

Our final set or recognitions are for academic achievement. First, let me ask our two high school principals to join me in the front, Mr. John Coscia, principal of Division Avenue High School and Mr. Joseph Sheehan, principal of MacArthur High School.

Tonight we are proud to recognize students from Division Avenue High School and MacArthur High School for their outstanding academic achievements as reflected through their performance in class and on college board assessments. We are thrilled to be recognizing over a dozen students, which is the highest number we had in years. I will first speak to the various awards our students are receiving, and then Mr. Coscia and Mr. Sheehan will introduce the students by name and the award or awards they are receiving.

We are recognizing students for achievements in awards designated by the College Board organization. The first is the National Merit Scholarship Program. This program is a well-regarded nationwide competition for recognition and awards conducted by National Merit Scholarship Corporation. Student are entered into the competition by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT last October. NMSC then identified the 50,000 highest scorers in the nation out over 3.5 million test takers. This represents

the top 1-2% of all test takers across the nation. Some 16,000 of those high performers were recently designated Semifinalists on a state representational basis. The remaining 34,000 high performers are named Commended Students.

National Recognition

In addition to the National Merit program, The College Board National Recognition Programs award academic honors to sophomores and juniors who take eligible administrations of AP®, PSAT/NMSQT®, or PSAT™ 10 exams, have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and identify as African American or Black, Hispanic or Latino. The criteria for these awards include:

- GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10 assessment scores that are within the top 10% of assessment takers in each state for each award program or earned a score of 3 or higher on 2 or more AP Exams in 9th and 10th grade.

Tonight we are honored to recognize the academic achievement of those students designated as National Merit semi-finalists, National Merit commended students, National African American Recognition Scholars and the National Hispanic Recognition Scholars. Their commitment to excellence serves as an inspiration to all of our students and a source of pride for our faculty and staff, their family and friends. I encourage each one of you to take pride in this accomplishment and to continue pursuing your academic and personal goals with the same dedication and enthusiasm.

I will now turn this over to Mr. Coscia to announce award recipients from Division Avenue High School.

Thank you Mr. Coscia. I will now ask Mr. Sheehan to announce the award recipients from MacArthur High School. Mr. Sheehan commented that “we usually average around two to three National Merit commended students each year which is a great number, but this year I am

astounded to say we have six National commended students so will The Following students please join me up front:

Ronald Gray Jr from Division Avenue:

1. STUDENT LIFE

- Division Avenue 11th graders as well as more than 40 faculty and staff members participated in Challenge Day on Oct. 18 and Oct. 19. Challenge Day is a social-emotional wellness program that focuses on building empathy and compassion. The Challenge committee will be adding students this year and initiating activities to continue to build on these capacities throughout the year.
- On Oct. 20 Division Avenue and MacArthur High Schools came together to host a Dig Pink event to support the Sideout Foundation and Breast Cancer Research. The JV and Varsity teams as well as staff members from both schools competed against one another for town bragging rights and to raise money for a worthy cause. The event was attended and raised a significant amount of money.
- On October 24th Division Avenue kicked off our Mentor Program with a "Meet and Greet" event. Staff mentors met the student mentees that they were matched with, enjoyed some refreshments, heard a brief presentation about the program and participated in a "get to know me" activity. The goals of the program are centered around building a relationship between a young person and a caring adult who can serve as a role model and life coach. This is the second year of the program at Division and the goal is to continue to grow the program every year.
- Our Peer Pals hosted a Halloween dance for our Career Development students on October 27th at 6:00 PM. The night was filled with dancing, singing, games, pizza and snacks, and awesome costumes.
- The Marching Band competed for the New York State Championship in Syracuse on Oct. 28th and placed third in the state in Small Schools Division 2.
- On Nov. 2nd Ms. Osterman and the Peer Leaders held our annual Fall Blood Drive. Once again it was a huge success with 70 units being donated, which is enough to save 210 lives!
- On Nov 8th teams of students and staff members came together for a "Dodge for Vets" event, to raise money for veterans of our armed forces.

- On November 17th, the Division National Honor Society hosted Junior Achievements High School Heroes, where 33 NHS members taught Summit Lane students about money and the economy
- On Nov 21st, members from wisdom lanes 8th grade choir came to DAH for a recruitment session with Mrs. Sellars and the concert choir.
- The November food drive was an enormous success. The classes collected 5 thousand items, 45 hot cooked meals from Seaqua deli, and \$1,300 in gift cards. It is one of the biggest events in the Spirit competition and it also accounts for a huge contribution to the Wisdom Lane Food Pantry.
- Members from Division Avenue's inaugural Division Ambassador Program participated in an inter-school breaking borders event at Syosset with Elmont, Syosset, and Roslyn to discuss leadership skills and how to develop cultures of unity and belonging.
- Teachers chose two Sophomores, Shane Villaume and Daniel Smith, to be representatives for the HOBY Leadership Seminar. HOBY was founded by actor Hugh O'Brian. HOBY's mission is to inspire and develop our global community of youth and volunteers to a life dedicated to leadership, service and innovation.
- We had numerous students receive all county honors in music.

2. ACADEMICS

- Alex Gao and Syeda Nowroz were named National Merit Scholar Semifinalists and submitted applications to continue to move on to consideration as finalists. Ceyda Nazli was named a National Merit Commended Scholar and in addition, she achieved the remarkable distinction of earning a perfect score on the AP Language Exam. Only 22 of more than 8,000 students received perfect scores.

- Alex Gao was also recently accepted to the United States Military Academy at West Point and will be attending next year. Our seniors were successful in dealing with the stressful November 1st college deadlines. Students met with their guidance counselors to submit their applications and were happy with the result.

Over the past two weeks and in the coming weeks, our senior class will have the opportunity to experience on-site college interviews with local colleges like Hofstra, NYIT, Adelphi, St. Joseph's University, St. John's University, Molloy, LIU Post, and Mount St. Mary's. Early results indicate that our students are doing very well and we are awaiting scholarship totals. This is a great experience for our students as you really have an opportunity to watch them grow throughout this process. So far 82 seniors have participated in on site admissions.
