✤ Animal Awareness Club, Ms. Palumbo

Athletes Helping Athletes (AHA) is an organization dedicated to promoting activities for young athletes that highlight the life lessons and skills inherent in sport so that they can experience the benefits and true value of athletic participation. AHA's mission is to inspire leadership through sport, while addressing social issues such as life skills, sportsmanship and civility, substance abuse prevention, violence prevention and physical activity.

This student group is responsible for operating lighting and sound for concerts and other school events, as well as assisting in the production of digital media.

✤ Big Dragons Little Dragons, Ms. Leest

The goal of this club is to help our elementary school students at Summit Lane. Members provide tutoring and also teach social skills to elementary students from Kindergarten through Fifth Grade.

The Broadcast Club gives students the opportunity to become involved in all aspects of creating news broadcasts that cover important events at Division Avenue High School. Students will announce the happenings at DAHS during the morning announcements.

This auditioned select vocal ensemble is for advanced vocal students who love to sing and want to learn a more rigorous repertoire. Students will perform at various school events as well as participate in school concerts. Auditions are conducted at the beginning of each school year.

Chamber Orchestra. Mr. Martufi

This is for advanced string students who love to perform. Students will prepare for various performances.

Digital Production Club, Mr. Engels

Students will help create digital content (videos, social media posts) to promote school news and events here at DAHS.

✤ Diversity Club, Ms. Wheeler

The purpose of this club is to promote awareness and appreciation of all cultures in our diverse school community. This club serves to enhance the school climate by ensuring that all students have a place they feel accepted and fostering connections among students and staff members of different backgrounds.

Emmy Night, Mr. Sparaco

Members of this club put together Emmy Night (an awards show) which is held in the auditorium at DAHS. Senior skits and other performances also take place. At Emmy Night, students come out to watch as the winners of the superlative categories are announced. While this is primarily a senior class club, students in all grade levels with video and/or editing skills are encouraged to participate.

✤ Jazz Ensemble, Mr. Rossi

A performance-based ensemble where students learn the art of jazz. They will explore this genre through performances and learn many facets of this American art form. Students will perform at the spring concert and various jazz festivals.

♦ Junior Chamber of Commerce Club, Mr. R. Kelly

A student organization that works in partnership with the Levittown Chamber of Commerce and other community businesspeople. Members of this club are provided with opportunities to attend Levittown Chamber of Commerce meetings and events, learn from guest speakers, acquire community service hours, and be entered to win a scholarship through the Levittown Chamber of Commerce.

✤ Key Club, Ms. Medina

A student-run organization that focuses on community service. This club also provides students with opportunities to hone their decision-making and leadership skills, while reinforcing the power of positive peer pressure. Students involved in Key Club also help out at many school and community events.

✤ Marching Band, Mr. Rossi

The DAHS Marching Band practices week in and week out to perform at several Marching Band competitions that take place on Sundays. The Marching Band also goes on a trip over the summer and performs at Homecoming and various marches.

✤ Mathletes, Ms. Gutheil

Mathletes is open to all sophomores, juniors, and seniors who wish to compete in math competitions against other schools. Competitions are held once a month, where students answer math questions and challenge students from surrounding districts. Winning schools are eligible to participate at the state level.

♦ Math Fair, *Ms. DeCunzo and Ms. DeCicco*

This is an excellent opportunity for students to explore a specific math topic, write a research paper on that topic, and present their findings to a panel of judges at Hofstra University in the Spring. Students will receive recognition for their participation in the competition and potentially earn medals.

* Musical Production, *Ms. Levenberg and Ms. LoGiudice*

Open to all students who would like to audition for a part in our yearly musical. Tryouts and rehearsals begin in November and continue through the April production. If you are passionate about drama, dance, and/or chorus and would like to showcase your talents, consider the musical as a place to do so.

Musical – Stage Crew, Set Design, and Construction, *Ms. Levenberg and Mr. Casciotta* This club is open to all students who have an interest in helping out with the musical either backstage during performances to keep the show running smoothly and/or in designing and constructing different sets.

Peer Leaders, Ms. Osterman

The Peer Leaders are responsible for mentoring and guiding the incoming freshman class and new students. They are chosen by a committee made up of teachers and are responsible for meeting with their designated freshmen throughout the school year. Peer Leaders are also in charge of organizing the bi-annual Blood Drive.

✤ Peer Pals, Ms. Verdi

This club pairs students with special needs with general education students. Peer Pals participate in activities, so that the club members have the opportunity to make connections and socialize after school.

Physical Fitness (Weight Room), Mr. Robins and Mr. Sparaco

✤ PosiDiv, Ms. Wheeler

A student group that performs activities related to the school-wide positive behavior support system, including organizing incentives and recognizing fellow students for exemplary behavior and character.

✤ Robotics Club, Mr. Bento

Robotics focuses on the F.I.R.S.T. Competition. Students are given a game and instructions for tasks for the finished robot to perform. Working together as a team, students construct the robot. This is a full-year, highly dedicated club that requires practices on the weekends.

✤ School Store, Ms. Winski

The School Store is open during lunch periods and sells supplies, snacks, and DAHS clothing. Students need to sign up in the first week of school to be eligible to work for the School Store. School Store workers are also responsible for working at Freshman Orientation, Homecoming, and Back-to-School Night.

✤ Science Olympiad, Mr. Marzigliano

Science Olympiad is a national science competition with over 5,000 teams from across the United States. Each team is made up of teams of 15 students who work together to compete in 23 science events. Students work with partners to participate in invitational and regional events. The top teams at the regional level qualify to participate at the NYS Finals. Event medals and team trophies can be earned at each level. Science Olympiad is for dedicated students who are required to meet three times a week from November through January and participate in competitions that take place on Saturdays.

Student Council, Ms. Castellano and Mr. Marzigliano

Student Council is responsible for organizing, preparing, and running major events at DAHS, including Pep Rally, Homecoming, and Spirit Week. All students are welcome at Student Council meetings and may vote on topics including the Homecoming theme and Spirit Week dress days. Student Council is also responsible for running Class Elections. Student Council oversees many events that the classes participate in, therefore, a class officer from each grade must attend Student Council meetings.

✤ Unity Club, Ms. LoGiudice

In this club, students work together to promote tolerance and acceptance throughout the school community and to provide a safe, non-judgmental space as a support network for the LGBTQ+ youth who share a common vision of social equality.
