ACADEMIC HONESTY

In order to protect the integrity of examinations, teachers are instructed to alert the Head Proctor and/or a building administrator if a student is suspected of academic dishonesty. Suspect behavior may include but is not limited to, providing or copying another's test answers or work, unauthorized materials in the testing room, and using an electronic device for any reason. All participants involved will be permitted to finish the test, but will receive a "zero" grade pending a hearing. For assessments other than exams, students must submit their own work, and expect it to be verified by the classroom teacher. Penalties for academic dishonesty will be subject to grading and disciplinary action.

NO CELL PHONES OR ELECTRONIC DEVICES ARE PERMITTED AT MIDTERM OR REGENTS TEST SITES

Students are prohibited from bringing cell phones and other electronic devices into a classroom or other location where a midterm exam or NY State assessment (Regents) is being administered. Test proctors, monitors, and school officials shall have the right to collect cell phones and other prohibited devices prior to the start of the test and to hold them while the test is being administered, including break periods. Admission to the test shall be denied to any student who refuses to relinquish a prohibited device.
