With the increasing demands on students over the past decade, parents and students have reported tremendous increases in stress and anxiety. Too many students in highly competitive schools feel overwhelmed and pressured, conditions that can lead not only to anxiety and depression, but also, to a host of dangerous manifestations of those conditions: substance abuse, eating disorders, sleep deprivation, cutting and other forms of self-injury, and sometimes, suicide. In light of the intensifying pressures on adolescents, what must we do now? For all our students, finding the right balance between an appropriate level of academic rigor and educating them in healthy, safe and balanced ways has crucial lifelong implications.
