The Board of Education adopted the proposed 2020/2021 school district budget at an open meeting on March 25, 2020 after a public process that lasted for three months. The budget maintains our excellent academic programs as well as our robust athletic, fine arts and extra-curricular activities. It maintains fiscal stability and accountability not only for next year, but for the years to come. This budget includes the resources necesary to open schools in September. Opening of Schools in September

The Levittown School District is committed to opening school in September and is currently preparing procedures to make that transition safe and healthy. People have asked, "If the Public Schools are closed by the Governor, will private schools also be closed?" The answer is YES. The decision to close schools is within the Governor's discretion. Voting no on the Levittown School District budget will have no effect on the Governor's decision. It will, however, have a negative impact on the programs we can offer the children of the Levittown School District.

What happens if the budget is not approved by the voters?

To date there has been no guidance from the Governor's Office on a revote. We anticipate if the budget does not pass, the district would be required to operate on a contingency budget, which could mean the elimination of all non-mandated programs such as sports, clubs, art and music. Although there would be a zero percent increase on the tax levy it doesn't mean your individual taxes will not increase, as that is within the discretion of Nassau County, who has the final say on the total levy of taxes. Adopting a contingent budget prohibits a district from spending any money in certain areas, including community use of school facilities, and field trips.
