## NY State Department of Transportation Fleet Summary Guidelines

| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| Heavy Duty <br> Mid Sized Bus <br> $\left(30^{\prime}-35^{\prime}\right)$ | 10 years | 350,000 | 22 out of 50 Large Buses |
| Medium-Duty <br> Bus $\left(25^{\prime}-35^{\prime}\right)$ | 7 years | 200,000 | 18 out of 31 Small Buses |

- Recommended New York State Department of Transportation Spare Factor is 20\% of peak fleet needed for service coverage of buses
- For Levittown 16.2 buses out of 81 total buses meets the recommendation for spare buses.
- $44 \%$ of Large Buses are past the New York State Department of Transportation Useful Life Standard of Ten Years
- $58 \%$ of Small Buses are past the New York State Department of Transportation Useful Life Standard of Seven Years

- Due to the age of these buses they are in jeopardy of not passing DOT in the future
- (1999-2011) 34 buses in total or $42 \%$ of the fleet face a parts issue. Most parts are not produced by the manufacture anymore causing us to purchase from the secondary market at a markup.
- Increased parts cost
- Longer parts delays
- Outsourcing bus repairs because of the age and the scarcity of the parts

## FUNDING?



- Due to the NY State Tax Cap Exclusions for the 2021-2022 school year:
- Bus purchases are covered under the capital exclusion and therefore are revenue neutral.
- Not purchasing buses in any given year causes future spikes in the budget and the tax levy.
