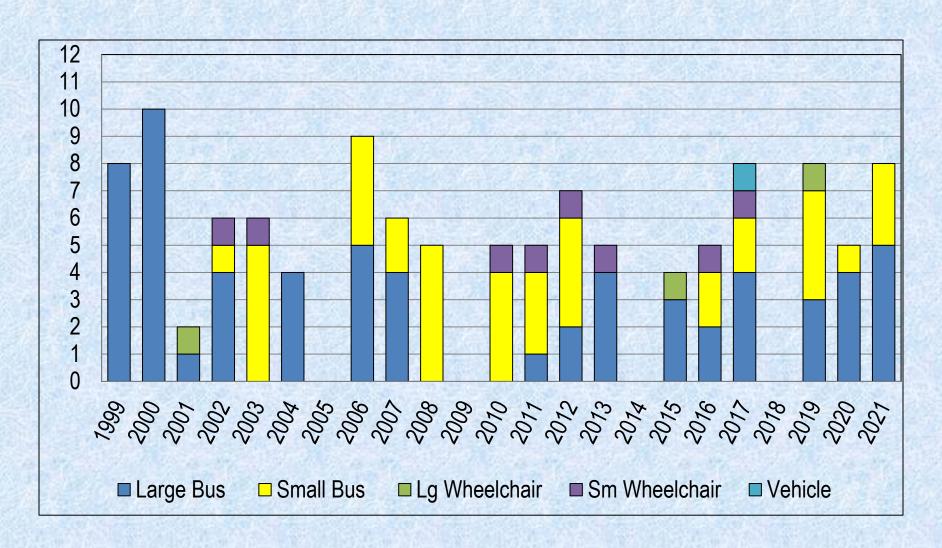

Points of Pride 2021-2022

- Operating transportation for a second straight year during COVID
- Largest in-house school district transportation department in Nassau County
 - Shared services with other districts
- Continued training for staff and students including:
 - Department of Transportation safety regulations
 - State Education School Bus Safety Requirements
 - Student behavior, and annual safety bus drills
 - Department of Homeland Security Training & Drills
 - Stop the Bleed training for all drivers and attendants
- Increased DOT Inspection rate over 97%
- Implemented and completed all internal audit recommendations and closed out all open items
- Utilizing Connect Ed messages to individual routes to inform parents of changes in transportation

Planned Initiatives 2022-2023

- Recruit drivers and attendants to the district
 - In-house training offered by dispatch
- Maximize route efficiency with software utilization & upgrades
- Investment in repair tools and software to diagnose repairs quicker
- Strive to decrease daily out of service vehicles
- Continue to improve the district fleet with consistent and balanced replenishment plan
- Explore new zero-emissions bus options
- Additional camera on large buses for increased coverage for health & safety
- Explore participation in Nassau County's School Bus Safety Program
 - Permits Nassau County to work with school districts to increase bus stop safety through camera monitoring. Bus cameras can help identify irresponsible drivers and ticket vehicles which illegally pass a bus stop
