I. <u>RECONVENE TO PUBLIC SESSION</u>

A. Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence - MacArthur High School Sign Language Club

The students from the MacArthur HS American School Sign Language Club led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance. Ms. Messina thanked them for attending. A moment of silence was observed on Pearl Harbor Day. "May we please have a moment of silence to remember the service members and civilians who lost their lives defending our country on that fateful day, as well as for those currently fighting to protect our nation at home and overseas."

Mr. Winch made a statement: "Before we move into reports, I would like to make a statement on a situation that occurred today at Division Avenue High School. This morning, the district was made aware of a situation involving the hacking of an individual student's district-provided email account. The account was used to send hateful messages containing racist and homophobic language to specific faculty and students at Division. Upon discovery of this, the district immediately reported the situation to the Nassau County Police Department. Following an investigation, the police were able to identify the individual responsible and the situation is now a police matter. Due to this being an active investigation, the district is unable to provide any further details. That being said, we want to make it absolutely clear, the language used in those messages is completely unacceptable and has no place in our schools or community. We condemn racism and homophobia, and this incident does not represent the good people in the Levittown school community. Our team of guidance counselors, social workers and school psychologists is available to provide support for any student or staff member who was impacted by this situation. It is also important to note the individual identified by police as responsible for the messages is not the student whose name is attached to the email which was illegally hacked. Please speak with your children about the importance of not sharing log-in credentials such as usernames and passwords with others.

We appreciate the community's support as we navigate this matter. Thank you".

Chris Evans - Division Avenue Student Liaison - "On Thursday, November 10th students in grades 9-11 attended a presentation by John Groshens, a retired police officer. Mr. Groshens gave a presentation on the dangers of alcohol, tobacco/vaping, and other drugs. It was a very impactful presentation. On Thursday, November 4^{th,} Division Avenue High School held its annual Fall blood drive with 76 donors, including staff members and students participating! This very successful effort, led by Ms. Katie Osterman and the Peer Leaders Club, exceeded the previous drive's total of 72 donations. Ms. Osterman was very proud of everyone involved, "It really highlights the generosity and character of our Division Avenue family."
