


Voices From the Field

"This was a very special activity for my second graders... Overall, I felt that this was very positive experience for everyone involved. I'm looking forward to working with these future teachers in the coming months."



- We also practiced delivering the lessons, with a focus on proper business attire, professional demeanor and tone, effective body language, and classroom presence.




Oh, the Places You'll Teach!
