Nonfiction Reading

Reading nonfiction is a great way for children to learn about the world around them. Many kids love to read about science and nature, as well as real people, places, and events. Explore nonfiction with your children and encourage them to read about topics of interests.

Reading Tips:

- Be a text feature detective! Take a close look at the helpful text features in a nonfiction book. These parts include a table of contents, index, glossary, photographs, labels, diagrams and charts with captions.
- Explore the Text! Nonfiction texts do not have to be read cover to cover. Readers can use the table of contents and index to jump right to the information they are most interested in.
- Read like a scientist! Stop and ask your child various questions about the text as you read.
