- Q. Is it true that 18% of population at Wisdom Lane MS was at a poverty level?

  A. Yes & unfortunately it is unique to Wisdom, per Dr. Grossane.
- Q. Do we know what the statistics are for this year?
  - A. No, we do not know the percentage for this year yet.

Superintendent Report ~ Dr. Grossane reminded everyone Central Administration will be starting the budget process sometime in November this year. He has asked the PTA Council budget committee & the Citizen's Advisory committee to get together, research & get questions/comments to Administration by January 15<sup>th</sup> at the latest. \* The district was a recipient of a legislative grant of approximately \$58,000. Mr. Porrazzo, the BOE Vice President, made a motion to split the grant amongst the buildings for special projects. The principals are going to submit their requests for special project to Dr. Grossane; he will then pass it on to the BOE. It was agreed upon that the elementary bldgs would receive \$3,000 each and the secondary bldgs \$9,000. \* October 24<sup>th</sup> is the BOE recognition meeting. After the planning session there will be a special meeting that is looking into the many capital improvements needed over the last year. The district will be moving forward with masonry & roofing projects. It will be funded through

undesignated reserve fund. It will be voted on at that meeting. \* In November the architects will be back for the DAHS kitchen/cafeteria final revisions & to present renovations for MacArthur as well. Ongoing initiative to improve instruction, assessments, performance, teaching. We've joined in a partnership with Hofstra University to work with our staff on critical thinking, raising literacy levels, the sciences and math, using research based instructional strategies & give them training.

Q. Has the district looked into the taxes increasing?

**A.** Dr. Grossane explained fully how the taxes are computed here in Nassau County and suggested parents call the Town and ask "why did my assessment change?" rather than why did my taxes go up?.
