General Membership Meeting

February 14, 2013

Meeting called to order 7:37. Pledge of Allegiance. Attendance was taken, a quorum was established. Moment of silence for the troops fighting for us to keep us safe.

Welcome Mr. Pappas - BOE President

Recording Secretary ~ Correction to Nominating section of notes- a person being nominated does not have to be a president but a voting member of the PTA Council unit for one year. January minutes approved with correction as written.

Treasurers' Report ~ - Report attached. The accounts were audited tonight by Mary Rickard & all was found to be in order.

Superintendent Report ~ Dr. Ianni has accepted an Asst Superintendent of Personnel position in the Harborfields school district & has tendered his resignation. The district will be advertising for the position shortly, probably after the February short break.

There were some concerns regarding the course catalog, we've asked the IT dept. to put it as a quick link on the front page of the secondary schools. Currently, it is under Parent Resources. Mrs. Rifkin & Dr. Grossane, along with the Guidance Chairpeople have decided that starting in early September the parents of secondary students will receive a letter outlining what the guidance department will be working on for that grade level for that school year. It will vary depending on what level your child is in. It will also be posted on the website, under the guidance department tab in each school's website. Prior to the registration process for students going into the high school & current high school students, there will be another letter outlining a typical schedule for the next grade your child will be entering, with some variations in electives for example. The idea behind this is to discuss with your child what your child is interested in, so changes are not made to the electives after the cutoff.

Student ID badges weren't given out at Salk because Mr. Zampaglione had received lots of complaints from parents afraid if the ID's were lost what would happen with the child's identity. It was decided to give out the ID's & if a parent did not want their child to have it they have to return it to Mr. Zampaglione.

Central office administration & the principals are meeting tomorrow with Nassau BOCES to go over our safety plan & then next week with the Office of Emergency Management for Nassau County for another review. Will report back after those two meetings.

An update to the Connect Ed system, it now has the capability to send either or /and a text message to the first number we have listed in the child's notification cards. Other numbers can also get the voice mail as well. Currently the administration is in the process of "switching" the home phone usually listed first with the first cell number to facilitate this capability. A bus list Connect Ed is also in the works.

The budget process has started. Central Administration is more than happy to come to the individual units to present the budget or a group. It was by show of hands that it was preferred to be presented to the individual units either by Dr. Grossane or Mark Flowers.

A calendar was adopted at the BOE, with school starting on September 4, 2013 for students. September 5th & 6^{th} are Jewish holidays so the students are off.

School goes through June 26, 2014. School must be in session through the rating day which is June 26th.

DAHS bids for the cafeteria were accepted. Masonry & roofing submissions were sent to NYSED which should take about 3-4 weeks for approval.

Q. With respect to all the days off next year, has there been an accounting of snow days, storm days etc.?

A. Yes, there are lots of places we can take back from should the need arise.

Remote access has been problematic at best. Teachers are not being that flexible to students, when they run into problems. Dr. Grossane will be speaking with Mr. Connell regarding it & will speak to the principals about saying something to the staff.

SAT Prep for the morning programs *might* not be continued for next year. The research done & the data that has been collected, it does not appear to be time well spent.

AP class summer work has been overwhelming for the students. The curriculum associates have been asked to review the summer assignments and perhaps modify them. In the course catalog, there are now Pre-AP classes being offered, with the understanding that they will continue with the AP classes.

Walkie Talkies:

Lunch aides will soon have Walkie talkies. Not sure on how many but at least on will be on the fields.

On Feb. 20,2013 a phone message will go out to all parents about a test text will go out. The test text will go out on Feb. 22,2013. At this time only one phone per student will be able to receive this text. They are certain that we will be able to include more phones at a later date.





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
