Superintendent's Report- Lots of work going on in buildings over the summer. Roof projects are done. DHS cafeteria was not complete the first 3 days of school. Food service line is done and up and running. Plans for MacArthur cafeteria are up at SED waiting on approval of amended plans.

Initial score reports came out-Commissioner of Education said to expect scores to decrease 30-40% and they did. Score Reports – BOCES sending them out later this year for some reason, they should be mailed out next week.

Dr. Grossane named the new staff in the district.

Questions were asked about APPR-can not FOIL the information. FERPA Law does not prohibit student information from being released to State.

Wellness Committee link is now on the district website.

Dr. Grossane will speak to Kathy re: dance/gymnastics program registration.

There are 2 overpass issues: Oakfield-Spoke with Mr. Goss and they are working hard with police, extra coverage. N. Jerusalem-reached out to Hudes, Murray & Dunn.

Middle school field trips: Wisdom does the trips, the community supports them and they work well. Salk-Mr. Z felt there was not much support for the trips. Parents at Council disagree and Dr. Grossane will speak to Mr. Z about it again.

There is a new program in K and 1 to identify students before they need remedial help.

At spring time enrollment was down, over 60 students moved in over the summer and now we are only down about 30-40 students where we initially thought it would be 100-125.

11th grade regent in January – traditional standards based regent and then a common core regent in June mandated by the State. June test will be scored form 300-800 points, but the student can put on their transcript which ever test they scored higher. The district will need a key to translate 300-800 point range into a grade appropriate for the report card. Algebra student will hae traditional standards based regent in June and then a common core regent a few weeks later.

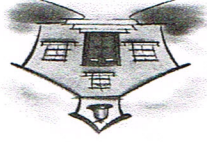

Superintendent's Report: Dr. Grossane stated that the district is presenting a same-services budget. Revenues will not meet our expenditures so we will be using the reserve fund. Currently a \$4.5 million deficit but 2nd half of the year we may find that our expenses are less than anticipated. Taking \$8.8 Million out of reserves but we can't do that every year as it will deplete the fund in three years time. Questions were raised about absences due to field trips. Students will be permitted to make up PE classes even if they have missed more than one class that quarter. Questions about Choral Club. Students are permitted to join the club even if they don't take the class but they must audition for the club. Question was asked about who coordinates the departments outside the buildings. During AP exams the grass was being mowed at MacArthur. Dr. Grossane will look into coordinating those activities so that it is quiet during exams. The district will also look into alternate locations for the AP Exams (ie. LMCC). Laurel Lane was suggested but that building is not in a useable state currently.

Gerald R. Claps Career & Technical Center (a/k/a GC Tech)

GC Tech is located at LMFC on east side of the building. We offer a 2-year program for 11th & 12th graders for students of Division & Mac Arthur High School as well as 20 plus out-of-district schools.

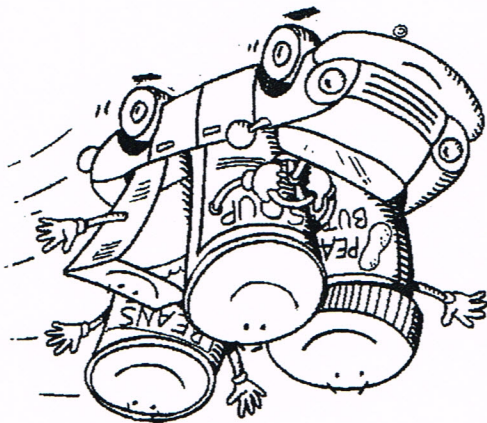
Our school offers career & technical programs which currently include Culinary Arts, Police Science/EMT (Emergency Medical Technician), Medical Assisting, Electrical Technology, Cosmetology, Graphic Communications, Automotive and 3-D Computer Animation, and Architectural Drafting & Carpentry (both of which are currently 1/2 day for the Senior students. All of our programs offer post secondary articulation agreements which are approved by the State Education Department. Our students earn college credits for the course they have successfully completed while at GC Tech which are accepted by technical colleges and post secondary schools. All of our programs include Technical Math and English as "push in" subjects. We also have a Special Education teacher "push in" to work with students in need or whole groups.

We also offer several Clubs for students: National Technical Honor Society (students are based on their performance at GC Tech). They participate in community activities and events. Key Club (is sponsored by The Kiwanis Club). They work with other organizations in joint services or fundraising activities and SkillsUSA. Every year students have the opportunity to compete in our GC Tech Skills Competition to demonstrate and showcase their skills which will be held on January 9, 2014 in the Gym at LMFC. Everyone is welcome to attend on that evening to observe our students hard at work in their program competition. Students also compete in SkillsUSA at the Regional Level (held at Farmingdale University) with students from Long Island Career & Tech schools, New York State Competition (held in Syracuse New York) with students from all over New York State and the National Competition (held in Kansas City, Missouri) with students from every state of the nation as well as Puerto Rico, Guam & The Virgin Islands. Over the past few years we have won over 80 Regional Awards, 40 State Awards and a silver medal from the National Conference.

On October 17th, SkillsUSA is holding its annual Pasta Dinner Fundraiser and Officer Induction in the Panther Room at 6:30pm. The meal of salad, pasta, meatballs, and dessert is prepared and served by the Culinary students. If you would like to join us, flyers are available with information.
