Treasurer's Report- See Attached. Treasurer Report is filed for audit. Donna Papa audited the books on Oct 22nd and all was found to be in order. Still waiting for dues from East Broadway and Gardiners Avenue.

Superintendent's Report

Debbie Rifkin sat in for Dr. Grossane and went over the Regents for Math and English.

Math Algebra 1 – all schools are required to teach common core course called Algebra 1 this year (Integrated Algebra) and students enrolled in this course must take common core regent-beginning in June. We will provide the traditional regent towards the end of June. They have to take the common core regent and kids can pick the higher score on transcript – Only for this June and August Regent Exam, as this is a transition period. New regent will be scaled as the NYS Assessments and will be scored the same 1-4. It is not clear if NYS is going to give a conversion chart or if districts will have to make a conversion.

8th grade taking Algebra 1 – would have to take 3 tests: the 8th grade math assessment, the common core regent and traditional regent. Districts are very close to getting a waiver so the students do not have to take the 8th grade assessment.

English – District had the choice on which regent to administer. Having only 1 year of common core English It is looking like we will give the traditional regent. AP class curriculum aligns better to common core regent and we are looking into that. No Decision has been made yet.

Questions were asked regarding Regents and dates.

Policy change from the NYS DOE, not the district. They have eliminated the option for an IEP diploma, so students with sever disabilities no longer have the opportunity to get that piece of paper that says "Diploma". These students can get local diploma and 2 types of credentials. There is good and bad. The good - It puts own-ness on the district to provide authentic experiences for theses students. Job coaching, life skills. Bad- these students used to be able to get the paper that says diploma. Policy went through first read last night at the BOE meeting.

SEPTA – Dr. Barry McNamara spoke about bullying and it was a great turn out. The candle fundraiser is almost over, but you can still order on line. There are flyers for all units. She explained where to find SEPTA on the district website.

Treasurer's Report- See Attached. Treasurer Report is filed for audit.

Treasury Reminders were handed out to all Presidents to share with their unit treasurer. Dues bills were also handed out, please bring payment to next Pres/Super Meeting.

Budget was presented with a change: During Exec Board meeting we move \$200 out of miscellaneous to a new line LEADD, because Council will have a LEADD table this year. Laura Brown made a motion to accept the budget as presented. Motion 2nd. Motion approved.

President's report- Report Attached.

1st VP- Working on folders-they need new paperwork. Will distribute at next President/Superintendent meeting or next Council Meeting.

2nd VP- Review the directory

Corresponding Secretary – Thank you cards from Kate Murray and Kathy Aldous

Superintendent's Report- Lots of work going on in buildings over the summer. Roof projects are done. DHS cafeteria was not complete the first 3 days of school. Food service line is done and up and running. Plans for MacArthur cafeteria are up at SED waiting on approval of amended plans.

Initial score reports came out-Commissioner of Education said to expect scores to decrease 30-40% and they did. Score Reports – BOCES sending them out later this year for some reason, they should be mailed out next week.

Dr. Grossane named the new staff in the district.

Questions were asked about APPR-can not FOIL the information. FERPA Law does not prohibit student information from being released to State.

Wellness Committee link is now on the district website.

Dr. Grossane will speak to Kathy re: dance/gymnastics program registration.

There are 2 overpass issues: Oakfield-Spoke with Mr. Goss and they are working hard with police, extra coverage. N. Jerusalem-reached out to Hudes, Murray & Dunn.

Middle school field trips: Wisdom does the trips, the community supports them and they work well. Salk-Mr. Z felt there was not much support for the trips. Parents at Council disagree and Dr. Grossane will speak to Mr. Z about it again.

There is a new program in K and 1 to identify students before they need remedial help.

At spring time enrollment was down, over 60 students moved in over the summer and now we are only down about 30-40 students where we initially thought it would be 100-125.

11th grade regent in January – traditional standards based regent and then a common core regent in June mandated by the State. June test will be scored from 300-800 points, but the student can put on their transcript which ever test they scored higher. The district will need a key to translate 300-800 point range into a grade appropriate for the report card. Algebra student will have traditional standards based regent in June and then a common core regent a few weeks later.

SEPTA – First meeting is Wednesday the 25th. Looking for parent members for CSE meetings. Sept 27 Yankee Candle Fundraiser. SEPTA membership letter went home in summer mailing at all schools except Salk/MacArthur.

Some shuffling of staff, very little hiring and an insignificant loss of jobs took place over the summer

New state assessments were based on the common core standards.

Most significant feedback is that the tests were much too long.

As predicted the scores dropped 30-40%. Was supposed to be standards based assessment but some of our teachers were on the scoring committee and reported that the cut score was set based on student performance.

Committee that did scoring was asked to take the test and most of these teachers couldn't finish in the time allowed.

One "highly effective" teacher in our district saw her students do poorly on the test, likely because she emphasizes "close reading" with her students and they couldn't do that and finish the test.

The district does employ other means to measure the students.

The state is providing guidelines for who get AIS. They are giving specific cut scores that aren't necessarily all the "ones" and "twos" like they used to be.

For instance, in math, not even all "ones" in some grade level will receive AIS according to cut scores provided by state.

Some honor students in the middle schools scored in the "two" range.

Relatively similar number of AIS students this year as last year. Score reports will come home end of September, but AIS parents have already been informed.

The district will not be ordering any test prep materials whatsoever. The Journeys program is so comprehensive that test prep is not needed.

New report cards for K-1 are being implemented to align with the Common Core Standards just as 2-5 were done last year.

Health and Safety Meeting

Topics brought up to look into:

The walkway west of Salk along the open field. Needs to be repaired and shoveled in the winter. Gary Hughes has been informed.

Abbey Lanes drop off situation. The school district will revisit it.

New Elementary School Behavior Contract forms will be looked into. They need to use language appropriate.

Wisdom:

New security person now in the afternoon, noon to 6 ish.

All eight fire drills have been performed and all went well.

Salk:

Evacuation Drill was performed on Oct. 10th. Salk notified parents, Gas station and neighbors of the drill. They had 10 buses available that day. 6th grade was housed in the auditorium and 7 & 8th graders were housed in the gym. The small board room was the command center. Everything went well and all students were back in Salk around 11 am. Connect Ed message went out to all parents notifying them of their Childs return to school.

They will be meeting with all authorities to go over the whole procedure to look at where they might need to improve. Praise did go out to the students on how well they all behaved that day.

Division:

All cameras and doors working well.

Seniors can enter back door only by showing their school ID.

2 fire drills so far and both went well.

MacArthur:

The new cameras and upgrades are working well. They are able to zoom in and move the cameras into different positions. They are now also able to archive the recordings.

Drop is working better now, They worked with Salk to use the Salk circle to help.

3 fire drills so far and all went well.

They have 10 people on their ERT (emergency response team)

Panic Buttons:

The cost to have the panic buttons installed in every phone in every school was extremely high. 3 New Panic buttons will be installed in every building soon. They will look more like the fire alarms.

BOCES:

BOCES and the police department are still working together to have the remote camera system working.

Door Access:

All building principals will have the capability to deactivate all staff entry cards in case of a lockdown. Certain personal will be able to override this action. An email alert will be sent out to all staff (staff out to lunch).

The times the cards allow entry has been updated. No weekend entry.

Secondary Curriculum-October 29, 2013

Wellness Committee recommends moving Health to 10th or 11th grade instead of 11th or 12th grade. They feel it is a priority to get it in sooner.

Common Core Regents:

Math Algebra I Common Core 8H and 9R - all students will take a CC Regents in June but will also take the traditional regents as well and be able to select the higher grade for their transcript. This is being offered to districts as an option because it is a transition year. New CC exam will be scored on a 1-4 scale with a conversion chart provided. 8H students have also always had to take the 8th grade assessment. We are seeking a waiver from the federal government so they won't have to take that test as well.

English- all students at the end of 11th grade. We are not giving the CC regents in English this year.

State has eliminated the IEP diploma. Local option still available. Same credits as regents diploma. Must have a 55 on English Regents and Math Regents.

Other option is now CDOS Credential. Career Development and Occupational Studies. The state believes this puts the onus on the district to provide vocational and technical training.

Skills and Achievement Credential – these students will take alternative assessments.
