- Congratulations to Ms. Going for receiving a \$500 Grant for their Garden based educational project for the 12:1:1 Life Skills Program at Wisdom Lane
- Introduced the guest speakers tonight, Evanthia Mamtsadoris and Raquel Dash. They will be teaching strategies for good behaviors using PAX Tools. Pax is being implemented in some schools, especially in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.

### Guest Speaker Presentation- PAX Tools

- Misbehavior has increased 20% in the last 1- years. Even more challenging due to the pandemic
- Some things we are seeing now: change in routine/lack of structure, increasing behavioral issues/aggression, restlessness/boredom, isolation, anxiety/fear of the virus, depression, lack of education, financial burdens on family, loss of motivation
- What do children need? Nurturing environment
  - 1. Increases psychological safety and flexibility
  - 2. Decreases or minimize toxic influence
  - 3. Richly reinforces pro social behavior
  - 4. Limits problem behaviors
- PAX Tools are evidence based and trauma informed
  - **1. Shared Vision**-clear expectations, specific, children are part of the discussion, adults and kids talk about what they want to see more of, see less of, hear more of, hear less of, feel more of, feel less of, do more of, and do less of
  - -Make a visual chart. Praise desired behaviors. This helps to reduce conflict – same page with expectations, child driven conversation, with parent offering guidance, ensure the more outnumbers the less
  - **2.** <u>Low-Emotional Responses</u>- adults provide instantaneous, neutral, non-verbal feedback without embarrassing the child or interrupting the activity. Use at first sign of unwanted behavior.
  - 1. Select/demonstrate non-verbal cues
  - 2. Explain using cues to send message (thumbs down, thumbs up)
  - 3. Model some behavior that may require the cue
  - 4. Praise

#### Increases attention for desired behaviors

- <u>3. Beat The Timer (visual timer)</u>- allows focus to stay on task and to finish and block out distractions
- 1. Select activity that causes conflict or often goes unfinished.
- 2. Provide clear instructions
- 3. Short amount of time
- 4. Remind child of goal and set visual timer
- 5. Praise good performance
- **4. Random Sticks** good to use at home when children feel things are unfair or that adults are playing favorites.
- 1. Create stick for each child or task
- 2. Draw for turns or to assign a task
- 3. Replace

Builds, improves, and maintains trust
