Components of a College Application

- Official High School Transcript
- Letter(s) of Recommendation
- Official SAT or ACT Scores self reported or sent from testing agency (if required)
- Essay and Supplements
- Portfolio or Audition (only for certain programs, art, music, etc.)
- NCAA Registration (for recruited athletes)

Most colleges will email you once you have submitted your application. Many will send the student a link to set up a **portal account** to track your application. It can take colleges 2-3 weeks to process your documents and update their system.

Be diligent and patient!

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High School Transcript

- Transcripts have been posted to the PowerSchool Portal
- Students should verify that all grades and Regents exam scores are accurate
- List of courses in progress are listed on transcript
- Some colleges require 1st Quarter Grades, and many require mid-year grades
- The final transcript is sent to the college you're attending
- It is crucial to put your best foot forward this year!

Recommendation Letters

Request Teachers in Naviance

• Teacher Letter (Core Academic Subject)

- Ask the teacher directly
- Add them to Naviance
- Complete teacher form

School Counselor

- **MUST** complete Student Comment Form
- Completed Parent Comment Form is encouraged and helpful!

*Outside Recommenders (coach, community organization, etc.) should be invited through the Common App (although not required)

Standardized Testing

Some colleges require the SAT/ACT, however, many colleges are test optional, meaning the student does not have to submit test scores. **Read directions** for the each college as some test optional schools may still require test scores for admission to special majors, programs and scholarships. If you are submitting test scores, they should "compliment" or add to the strength of your application. Submitting strong scores could result in more scholarship money.

College Essay & Supplements

The College Essay is an important part of your application that helps give a glimpse of your personality to the admissions committee. It is important to take your time formulating your essay.

Developing Your College List

The goal is to find the best fit college that meets your academic, social and financial needs...

- Likely: a school where your academic credentials fall well above what the school is requiring
- Target: a school where your academic credentials fall within the range the school is requiring
- Reach: a school where your academic credentials fall short of what the school is requiring



- **Common App** (commonapp.org): over 1100 colleges will accept this application, including many SUNY schools
- College Specific Applications (MIT, UC Schools, Georgetown
- **SUNY** (suny.edu): State University of New York application
- **CUNY** (cuny.edu): City University of New York application
- Nassau CC (ncc.edu): online application

Types of College Admissions



Early Admissions

- *Early Decision*: Binding agreement, can only apply to **ONE** school under this plan
- *Early Action*: Non-Binding, apply late fall and usually get a decision by early winter. Can apply to multiple schools under this plan
- **Restrictive Early Action**: May restrict students from applying Early Action to more than one school

Regular Admissions

- **Regular Decision**: Apply by the college's regular deadline which is usually early winter and receive notification by early Spring
- **Rolling Admissions**: Applications are reviewed as they are received and decisions are "rolled out" students should not wait too long to apply because programs can fill up quickly

Application Process Deadlines

Student Submits:

Online Application Self Report or Official Test Scores (if needed)

Guidance Submits:

Official Transcript Letters of Recommendation Secondary School Report

*Please be mindful of your deadlines! The Guidance Office requires students to submit their transcript request through Naviance before the college deadline so that applications can be processed in

To Do in Common App:

- 1. Create Common App Account
- 2. Complete the *Education* Section
- 3. Add at least one College
- 4. Complete the Common App FERPA Release Authorization
- 5. *Match* your Common App to Naviance <u>https://www.screencast.com/t/gxEQkElyo1</u>

To Do in Naviance:

- 1. *Colleges I'm Applying To* List Should Be Accurate (deadline, application type, etc)
- 2. Request your *Initial Transcript* to be Sent to your Colleges (adhere to deadlines)
- 3. Request teacher recommendation letters
