Legislation- Diane McPartland- attended the Nassau Region Legislation Brunch and reported to unit that Legislators are fighting for Long Island's fair share. For many an increase in last year is still lower than 2 years ago so we are still struggling.
SEPTA-Diane McPartland for Liz Kirk- Mrs. Block a special education teacher from Salk spoke regarding an article she read about a girl named Zoe who is learning disabled and attends Vassar. She is extremely determined and makes a large chart of notes to get her through each day. Pamela Zimmer Special Needs Director at Camp Kehilla was the guest speaker. She discussed how Regular Ed students regress 2 months during the summer and most Special Ed kids regress about 5 months in the summer. Some districts have 12 month IEPs. Children with these must receive at least 30 days of instruction during the summer so that they can reach and maintain their goals. Next meeting is March $18^{\text {th }}$. Report on file.

## Special Committees

ByLaws- Lynn Petrofsky- reviewed the proposed changes to the Bylaws to be voted on next month.
Officers \& Election- council delegates will no longer be elected, they will be appointed. This does not affect the 2013/2014 slate. Nominating Committee- will consist of 5 members- 3 from the Executive Board and 2 from General Membership. Alternates if desired can be part of the procedures.
Nominating Committee- consent to run from floor will be changed to 2 business days notification. The number of days and presentation month can be included in the procedures. Council Delegates- to stay in line with Officers \& Election they are appointed in the same way as Committee Chairs. Executive Board- a quorum will consist of 15 .
Division Avenue Sweeps- Laura Brown- reviewed the prizes available and pricing for raffle tickets. Baskets will be kept in East Café and event will be held in the large gym. Council Budget- Peter Calabrese-discussions included: having retired police officers as security personnel; better use of work study program in MS; charging a service charge for outside districts for refueling their busses; act on energy saving resources not just research them; replacing Bauman bus drivers with district bus drivers.
Elementary Curriculum- Angela List- Debbie Rifkin introduces Commerce Plaza which is a program for $5^{\text {th }}$ graders hosted by YES Community Counseling Center in Levittown. District would like to bring all $5^{\text {th }}$ grade students. Train one teacher and then turn-key training. Commerce Plaza is a simulated business community that promotes and understanding of the world of business and economics. It is a full day on site field trip in which students act as retail operators, producers of services- banker, doctor etc., which
integrate lessons learned from the 6 week in class curriculum. Engageny.org has posted a parent Tool Kit for understanding Common Core State Standards for K-5 in both ELA and Math. It can be found on the district website. Journeys Pilot Program- piloting ELA program one per elementary building. Debbie Rifkin is not yet comfortable recommending the program for all students next year although the program is going well according to the teachers using it. She would like to wait until the students take the state assessments to see how well the program is aligned with the assessment. Students in grad 2 should be using a cursive workbook. Each teacher is required to teach each letter, they do not go in great depth and it is up to the teacher discretion after $2^{\text {nd }}$ grade as far as what more is taught. Food Service- Lisa Curran- some contract changes are forthcoming due to changes from NYS and Federal level. Not sure how revenue will be impacted. New café for Division by September. Breakfast survey went out to elementary students.
Dollars for Scholars- Diane McPartland- next meeting is $3 / 18$.
Secondary Curriculum-Science Curriculum chair Kevin McDermot spoke about the science programs. In Middle School to get into excelerated science a student's science, math and ELA scores are taken into account. There is also a teacher recommendation. At the high school level there is a form that a student can fill out to request honors level science. Next year Chemistry will run with a lab every other day. Debe Rifkin updated on the curriculum by department, this is on the district website. The curriculum is being "scaffolding" to prepare students. The curriculum builds on itself. Report on file. Wellness- Lisa Curran- Tony Goss is the new chair of the committee replacing Keith Snyder.
