## DIVISION AVENUE HIGH SCHOOL PTSA MEETING MINUTES, Mon, Feb 5, 2018

Linda Pereira called the meeting to order at 7:00pm, followed by the Pledge.
President's Report - Linda Pereira welcomed all attending and provided updates since the last meeting. On January $18^{\text {th }}$, Lynn Testamark attended the President/Superintendent meeting: Dr. McDonald stated that a student in the district is being considered for the Presidential Scholarship; participation in the Principal Project Advisory Commission for principal training and preparedness; the Levittown for Levittown Fundraiser, raised over $\$ 15,000$ for Levittown, Puerto Rico to help three schools in P.R., donating a generator and uniforms. Track field at MacArthur got a new vendor; new pallets on the turf fields that reflect sunlight are going to be cooler to be done in the spring. Division's turf going to be redone over the summer. Budget presentation is being presented, starting with facilities and still draft form. Big Items planned for district wide are camera upgrades, fire systems and alarms, ceilings at Division library, windows at Division, bathroom renovations at Division during the summer, Baseball field at Wisdom Lane MS; electrical service upgrades will be continued; Transportation will be updating their GPS system and purchasing one large bus. Council Budget submitted requests to the School Board. Invitations will be going out soon for the Senior Award Dinner Dance.
Superintendent was asking for more kindness from Levittown residents on social media towards their district employees and each other. Residents can contact the district or school directly if there are any concerns.

## Principal's Report - Mr. Coscia updated membership on the school's ongoing activities and few achievements within

 the school body:- Past month, busy with taking mid-term exams and regents
- Proud of the Division's Science Olympiads, going to states for the $10^{\text {th }}$ consecutive year, earning medals in 15 of 22 events
- Mr. McElroy is spearheading one of the schools efforts to implement a Positive Behavior Intervention Supports Framework- meant to supplement our safety and discipline from a positive proactive view regarding behavior, involving a committee of teachers and different staff members and define expected behaviors around the core social values of the community when participating in daily events at schools. Based on early intervention research in promoting positive behaviors in different methods to encourage such behavior or working with individual students that are having difficulty.
- Guidance Department organized an elective fair for students in grades 9-11, teachers from eight departments (including GC Tech) set up displays outside of cafeterias east and west, providing information to students regarding electives in their respective areas.
Feedback from students was great, and requested that more of the electives that are offered in school to be there, as well having a list prior to the show and possible expand to two days for those without a lunch period
- Fundraiser was held on January $25^{\text {th }}$ for Jaime Macias, senior and also member for Track\&Field, raising money for him and his family who are going through extensive treatment for a malignant brain tumor. Thankful to John Theissen Children's Foundation for organizing the event.
- Division has started "Division Donation Days" for each month to support different causes, students are able to wear certain apparel and donate on those particular days for that assigned month. December was Toys for Tots, January was for Wounded Warriors and February was for Jaime Macias.
- Challenger games have begun, first game is on February $5^{\text {th }}$ at Wisdom, February $27^{\text {th }}$ at Division and Challenger Homecoming on March $1^{\text {st }}$.
- Locker Room update - Date is pushed for completion, hoping for end of March - Senior Parking is still not available as well, as the baseball fields will start construction for the dug outs and bullpens to be built
- Gym lobby bathrooms will be started in the summer; Turf fields and Track work will begin in June Question was made by parents that the Softball fields keep getting looked over as it might be a girl sport
- Sports Update: Boys Wrestling progressing well with new athletes coming abroad, Girls Basketball have made the playoff for $23^{\text {rd }}$ year; Kickline competed at Nassau Community College; Cheerleading did well at Nationals in Disney, Swim Team doing great as well, two swimmers looking to quality for state tournament, Winter Track had 9 girls and boys beat personal records, one being in contention for the Country Qualifiers
- Upcoming Events: Emmy Nights; Spirit Week and Night; Jr Prom and Pre-Prom workshops for seniors and their parents.
