Primary Factors Used to Evaluate Applicants


- Academics!!!
- Rigor of curriculum
- Grades / GPA
- SAT/ACT score (...maybe)

Secondary Factors Used to Evaluate Applicants

- Involvement in school and community
- Teacher and counselor recommendations
- Essays
- Demonstrated interest in the institution:
 - Visiting campus / College Fairs/ HS visits
 - Interviews
 - Follow-up notes / emails
- Recruited / athletics, fine arts audition, portfolio

No Control...

- Transcript/Completed Grades
- Letters of Recommendation
- Where you live
- Where you went to high school




Where you have control...

The Resume/Activity List


- Make a list of all activities you participated in during your high school years (both in an out of school)



How to demonstrate interest without traveling to campus

- Check your email
- Attend college visits
- Reach out to your admissions counselors
- Set up chats, one-on-one appointments, interviews if available
- Attend webinars, virtual open houses/tours
- Submit a carefully crafted application ON TIME

All of these efforts show you care about your application

After Applications are submitted...

Check your email DAILY for

- Let's talk about email addresses...
- Confirmation that applications were received
- Instructions for creating an application portal
- Requests for additional information
- Information about new programs on campus
- Opportunities to interact with Admissions Counselors or current students
- \$cholarship applications
- Notification of decisions!

What is Financial Aid?

Financial aid consists of funds provided to students and families to help pay for postsecondary educational expenses



What is Cost of Attendance (COA)?



Direct Costs + Indirect Costs = Cost of Attendance



Direct Costs (Tuition, Fees, Room & Board



Indirect Costs (Books, Supplies, Transportation, Spending money



Varies widely from college to college

Categories of Financial Aid



Need-based aid

Need is determined based on FAFSA, TAP and CSS Profile (if required)



Non-need-based aid

Usually merit scholarships

Types of Financial Aid



GIFT AID:

GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS



SELF-HELP AID:

LOANS AND WORK-STUDY

Gift Aid: Scholarships



Money that does not have to be paid back



Awarded based on merit, skill, or unique characteristic

Scholarships can be need or non-need based

Gift Aid: Grants





MONEY THAT DOES NOT HAVE TO BE PAID BACK

USUALLY AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF FINANCIAL NEED

Self-Help Aid: Loans

Money students and parents borrow to help pay college expenses

Repayment usually begins after education is finished

Only borrow what is really needed

Look at loans as an investment in the future

Self-Help Aid: Work-Study Employment



Allows student to earn money to help pay educational costs

A paycheck; or Nonmonetary compensation, such as room and board



Student may opt whether or not to work or number of hours to work

Civic organizations and religious groups

Federal Government

Largest source of financial aid

Aid awarded primarily on the basis of financial need

Must apply each year using the FAFSA

Federal Student Aid Programs

 Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH)
 Grant
- Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)

SELF-HELP AID

- Federal Work-Study (FWS)
- Subsidized and Unsubsidized Federal Direct Student Loans (Direct Loans)
- PLUS Loans

New York State

- Excelsior Scholarship
- Enhanced Tuition Award (Private Schools)
- STEM Incentive Scholarship

Must attend college in NY State

Colleges & Universities



Award aid on the basis of both merit and need



Aid may be gift aid or self-help aid



Use information from the FAFSA, and/or CSS Profile, and/or institutional applications



Deadlines and application requirements vary by institution

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

TAP (New York State <u>Tuition Assistance Program</u>)

CSS Profile (College Board)
