I just have a quick update on the National PTA's upcoming dues increase.

As we discussed during our last meeting, the National PTA will implement a dues increase of \$1.00 effective July 1, 2025. This adjustment will result in our current dues of \$2.25 being raised to \$3.25. After extensive discussion with other units, the PTA council, and our executive board, we have resolved to increase our membership dues from \$10.00 to \$12.00. This change will necessitate an update to our bylaws, which will be presented at next month's meeting. The revised bylaws will reflect the adjustment in dues.

 - Testing This Wednesday is the ELA iReady exams and next Wednesday will be the math iReady. Delayed bell schedule and shortened periods after the test completion. - Transportation Yeliz Cipriano January's transportation meeting was held via zoom at 10 AM
 - Meeting started with Mrs. Reeves, telling everyone about a Newsday article on December 22 regarding a bellmore/Merrick district bus student, wrote about his positive experiences with his bus driver over the years. It was a nice article displaying the positive impact that a bus driver can have on the students.
 - As for hiring, we have a new bus attendant starting tomorrow we have a new driver in training but we did have one bus driver retire on Friday so every time we hire one we lose one, so we are still understaffed with both bus, drivers and bus attendants
 - District is still using an agency to hire temporary bus attendants and they're hoping that they will get five new hires very soon from the agency which will help with staffing
 - The 4:45 late bus that we currently have does not have many students on it. It will continue for the rest of the year however, more than likely will go away in September for the next school year.
